



## Colorado Attorney General Threatens Legal Action against Boulder County's Moratorium on Oil and Gas Development

On Thursday, January 26, 2017, Colorado Attorney General Cynthia Coffman issued a statement declaring that the State of Colorado would take appropriate legal action against Boulder County ("County") if the County does not rescind its ban on oil and gas development within its borders by February 10, 2017. Since February 2012, the County has prohibited oil and gas development through a series of temporary moratoria. Despite some of the moratoria being deemed "temporary" by the County, the moratoria have had an ongoing, continuous effect. The County's most recent moratorium against oil and gas development was enacted on December 13, 2016, and extends through May 1, 2017. The most recent moratorium was enacted by the County despite the Colorado Supreme Court's recent decisions maintaining local governments may not ban oil and gas development.
